The facade of the building replicates the exterior of St. James's Gate Brewery in Dublin, the oldest working brewery and the home of Guinness Stout since 1759. It was important to the owners that the new James's Gate reflected the spirit of it's namesake.



The pub side was designed to be an authentic Irish pub. The owners traveled throughout New England collecting 200 year old wood, antique church pews and paneling, hand cut beams, and Vermont slate tiles. Nearly all of the interior trim was fashioned from this
